

Albuquerque & Quintessence Real Estate Market

The most often asked question I receive as a real estate broker is "How's the market?" A quick look at the statistics for 2023 will give insight as to how the Albuquerque market, and Quintessence neighborhood specifically, are performing.

The table below is a recap for 2022 vs 2023 in the greater Albuquerque area (single family detached)

Overall, the decline in total sales and dollar volume from 2022 to 2023 is largely attributed to the rise in mortgage rates. Many potential buyers sat on the sidelines in 2023 in the hopes that mortgage rates would decline. As we now know, there was no significant decline in mortgage rates with rates hovering around 7%. The 30-year fixed mortgage interest rate went from an average of 3.22% in January of 2022 to 6.5% in

January of 2023. The annual average 30-year mortgage rate for 2023 was 6.8%. For a \$550,000 home purchase with 20% down, a rise in mortgage rates from 3.5% to 6.5% equates to a principal and interest payment increase from \$1975 to \$2781—a difference of over 40%!

These rising rates having created a gridlock of sorts...current homeowners with a low rate are reluctant to move unless there's a compelling reason. This has kept home inventory low which is why we continue to see a rise in home prices despite the rising mortgage rates.

How about the good news? For sellers, the low inventory market means you can still get top dollar for your home. It's imperative to strategically price the home and ensure your home is in top notch shape prior to going on the market. For a buyer, you have less competition than you did in 2022. Be prepared to make a fair offer for a home, but there may be a little more room for negotiation. Many buyers are asking sellers to contribute towards a temporary (1-2 year) mortgage rate buy down.

What's the outlook for this year? Buyers may have to get more comfortable with the current mortgage rates, as a significant decrease in rates is not expected. Current rates are in line with the historical (1971-present) average of 7.74%. With many homeowners locked into low rates, experts are not predicting a meaningful increase in housing inventory this year. Quintessence continues to be an in demand and desirable neighborhood.



Locker #505 student clothing bank is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization that has established a student-focused facility where children can try on and choose outfits that they feel good about wearing. Having appropriate school clothing allows children to concentrate on their school work, not their clothing. It also helps keep children, who might not go to class because of their clothes, stay in school.

Since Locker #505: Students Clothing Bank opened in 2014 we have had more than 22,000 referrals and just this school year we have served almost 4,000 students, thanks to the generosity of Albuquerque citizens.

What we wear may leave a lasting impression on those around us. For this reason, it is vital that everyone present their best selves to bolster their confidence and self-worth. By providing comfortable, suitable clothing, students can focus on their education without worrying about what they're wearing.
